A short biography of J.M. Coetzee

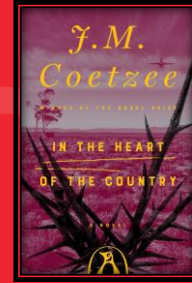
John Maxwell Coetzee, famous South Africa author.

- Currently lives in Adelaide, SA

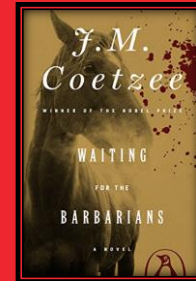


Major Works

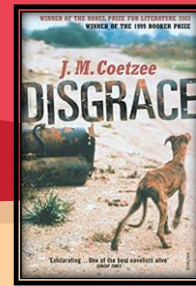
- The narrator, Magda, tells the story
